5. Examination reforms implemented:

The university has taken following steps to reform the examination system:

- (a) The design of question paper has been modified. Now the paper is divided, for all practical purposes, into three segments. The first segment of the paper has only one question comprising five short answered questions which is compulsory. The words limits is fixed at 200 words for each answer.

The second segment of the paper, identified as section 'A' is meant for long answered questions out of which a student is to answer only two. The words limit has also been imposed and it is 1000 word for each question. The section 'B', the third segment of the questions papers, has four question having two sub section and a student has two answer any two questions of this segment. The words limit for each part of the question has been restricted to 500 words.

- (b) The facility of providing 'B' answer book to an examinee during the examination has been withdrawn due to the implementation of policy of limiting the answers into certain number of words (as mentioned in above(a)).
- (c) University has introduced semester system at P.G. level for the students

studying in the residential campus of the university and the students perusing the science P.G. course in the college also.

For the students studying in the affiliated college and pursuing P.G. courses in the subjects of Arts and commerce the course and syllabi is an annual basis.
